Coffee with Paston Jaci



After a scattered and harried day, I decided I'd love a cup of coffee. To my chagrin, I discovered I was only a few grounds short of having none. So, adding in another errand to my day, I headed out to buy some. I went to the store closest to home, which tends to have a good selection so I was confident it would have my favorite brand. Lo and behold they did have it and it was on sale, with over a 30% reduction. I was feeling pretty pleased with myself and with the store.

But I did not have my frequent shopper card with me. The woman troubleshooting in the self-checkout area kindly offered to enter an alternate number, but no discount showed up. She said, "Oh, it must be an electronic coupon." True confession: I did my best not to glare. I pulled up the app and, sure enough, I had not yet created a login to be able to receive electronic coupons, and I didn't do it then, either. Instead, I went to another store and paid a dollar more than the sale price at store #1 for the same coffee ... with no rigamarole (and I was still \$2 ahead!).

In Jesus Christ, we face no rigamarole to get to God. In Jesus Christ, we have direct access and don't have to jump through hoops to receive gifts and blessings and forgiveness and the hope of eternity with him. We don't have to be tracked so that God knows our preferences. He knows them perfectly well and knows that they aren't all in our best interests. God does not do a bait-and-switch on us, saying – "Oh, that promise? That only applies in some circumstances, only if you qualify through special pathways and portals." There are no special codes or requirements. Only faith in Christ. And God's promises stand firm for everyone who believes in Christ. Yes, gifts and fruit become more mature as we grow in our submission to him and his ways; but he's been pretty clear about that since the days of Moses.

We serve a God who is Faithful and True. He is who he is and does what he promises. We are blessed in that assurance. Rejoice that we have an awesome God, and head into the rest of this day and into every tomorrow with that assurance.

THE FOUR-CENTS-A-MEAL PROGRAM IS EVOLVING

The Four-Cents-A-Meal program has evolved to be called "Cents-Ability" by the Presbyterian Hunger Program. To keep up with this changing, vital ministry of our denomination, the Presbytery has created a Hunger Funds sub-committee of the Committee on Mission & Outreach (CMO). This new team will manage and promote hunger-action donations and initiatives.



Many congregations in our Presbytery participate in Cents-Ability donations - usually once a month. These donations that help alleviate hunger are forwarded to the Presbytery and are then distributed to 32 organizations in our local areas and across the globe. We currently divide the donations 60% to local hunger agencies and 40% to national and international organizations, including the Presbyterian Hunger Program. These funds are distributed quarterly and usually total around \$11,000. This giving program has grown over the years into a very significant ministry!

\$1515 Music News \$1515

July 17, 2024 will be Isaac Watts 350th birthday. Hopefully you're at least acquainted with that name; Watts is credited with writing as many as 700 hymn texts, including Joy to the World; When I Survey the Wondrous Cross; Alas! And Did My Savior Bleed; Am I a Soldier of the Cross; My Shepherd Will Supply My Need; Our God, Our Help in Ages Past; I'll Praise My Maker While I've Breath; I Sing the Mighty Power of God; and Jesus Shall Reign Where'er the Sun. On July 21, as Pastor Jaci concludes her sermon series on the Lord's Prayer ("For Thine is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen"), we will sing the last two of these.

One of the striking (and somewhat antiquated) expressions found in Jesus Shall Reign is found in the concluding stanza, "Let every creature rise and bring honors peculiar to our King." It's important to note that these honors are not peculiar in and of themselves, but are, rather, "peculiar to our King". In other words, there are some honors that we reserve for God and no other power or authority. Even though we don't use the word "peculiar" to mean unique very often today, Watts intent is clear when we take a few minutes to refect. Some newer hymnals render this phrase as "peculiar honors to our King," which means something altogether different (and misaligns the syllabic and metric accents, making it harder to sing). I invite you to take a few minutes to read and ponder the text in preparation to sing this hymn on July 21. And to remember to render to God the honors that belong to Him alone.

1 Jesus shall reign where'er the sun does its successive journeys run; his kingdom stretch from shore to shore, till moons shall wax and wane no more.

2 To Him shall endless prayer be made, And praises throng to crown His head; His name, like sweet perfume shall rise With every morning sacrifce.

3 People and realms of every tongue dwell on his love with sweetest song; and infant voices shall proclaim their early blessings on his name.

Blessings, Heather 4 Blessings abound where'er He reigns; The prisoners leap to lose their chains, The weary fnd eternal rest, And all who suffer want are blessed.

5 Let every creature rise and bring honors peculiar to our King; angels descend with songs again, and earth repeat the loud amen!
