I pray that each of you had a special Christmas and will have experienced the arrival of 2025 in a meaningful way. Some of us wish we had had more interaction and celebration and, honestly, some of us wish we had had less. The new year can be a time to reflect on how to make the best of our situation by practicing intentionality - having a plan that offers an option to observe a special day in an uplifting way, without making others responsible for us.

Then shall your light break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up speedily; your righteousness shall go before you; the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard."

Isaiah 58:6.8



The season of Epiphany (from the 12th day of Christmas to Ash Wednesday) celebrates the Light of Christ coming into our dark world. We begin our Epiphany journey with the arrival of the Magi, guided by a star lighting their way and conclude with repentance that purifies us to reflect His light. It is, thus, appropriate both to pray for light as God's provision and to recommit to partnering in His light production. The above verses from near the end of Isaiah are part of a call for God's people to return to sincere, authentic worship and justice. If the nation of Israel obeys, God promises light and healing and protection.


During the season of Epiphany, our sung opening prayer will similarly petition for light and health. "Light for Our Darkness" is a text by John Bell, a Presbyterian minister long-associated with the Iona community off the coast of Scotland, which focuses on justice and has produced many songs for church use (eg "The Summons"). This prayer is particularly appropriate for our time as global unrest and societal division seem to rule the day and create seemingly impenetrable darkness. It is my prayer that as we sing these words, we will truly turn to Jesus for light, faith, healing, and—most importantly—His very presence. I invite you to take a few minutes to read the words we'll be singing.

Light for our darkness, faith for disbelief, health for mind and body when they languish; Christ, be among us, listen to our prayer, lift your weary people from their anguish.


