



Coffee with Pastor Jaci A note from your pastor ~



Current events around the world right now make for some intense news. For some of us, it's frightening. For others of us, it makes us angry. Some respond with compassion and tears. Some of us turn unspoken and unrealized emotions into stress and anxiety. Whatever your gut response to all that is happening – unprecedented flooding in North Carolina, an escalation in Middle East military activity, or any other myriad of things – it would be good for all of our hearts, minds, and nerves to be sure to pray every day about those things that trouble us the most.

Some of you may say in response, "Boy, that sounds just like a pastor. These are real world problems that need real world solutions, not just a spiritual response." But the strategy is tested and true. This approach is what we find in many of our beloved Psalms. King David would express to God his anger, fears, fatigue, anxiety, even hatred of his enemies over what was happening around him, about things and people that impacted David and his life. And pretty much every single time, the emotion that arose out of David's distress would resolve itself into trust, praise, and gratitude to God for his faithfulness and provision.

As Christians, we have a terrific gift in being people with one foot in this world, and one foot in God's eternal kingdom. We have a lifeline and a hotline, and they both flow two ways. We can call on the Creator of the universe to do something about the things that trouble us most. We are at our very best when we then remember that he has done something very significant – he has given us Jesus. He has given us his Spirit. As a result, we get to live as his representatives. Our calling is to live in ways that bring his love and his light into the world, giving hope to others that all is not lost. When we realize the tremendous value of all he has given us in Christ, we can praise God as David did. And when we are people of praise, the world gets a little a lighter for those around us.

And, when we lift it all up to the Lord, we look "up" to him. We move our focus away from the chaos. We are reminded that God is truly great, he loves us, we belong to him, and he has invited us to work with him. When we do, the world becomes a better place. When we don't, it can be difficult to find peace. Like the hymn says,

What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer!

O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer![1]

Taking it to the Lord in prayer makes our lives and the world better. Prayer is, in business speak, an "action item." It's more than a desperate fallback position. Let's do it together.




Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:2-6)

This passage describes exactly how I feel about you.

I love how Paul characterizes the reason for his own thanksgiving – because of how the Philippians shared in the Gospel. What a wonderful corrective to many present-day clunky divisions between ministry, mission, outreach, and evangelism!

You most definitely share in the gospel. You take its calling seriously yet are far from dour in carrying it out. You demonstrate love and joy as you work together to be the church, touching lives in this region. Your giving, with hand and heart, make you a source of refreshment.



Your leadership is excited to announce that Stewardship Sunday will take place on October 20, when we will all enjoy a time of storytelling in worship, reminding us all of the value and the impact of our giving and our participation in the full life of the church.

What is stewardship anyway? For those of us who have been around the church forever, we know it has a lot to do with financial giving. But it is about so much more. It's about being God's stewards, his managers, here on earth. He allows us to manage his creation and all the resources it contains. We also manage our lives – our time, our talents, our affections, and our finances. Following Stewardship Sunday, you will receive commitment cards which will allow you to communicate to the church the ways you intend to share those things with and through Front Royal Presbyterian Church.

I am excited to see how God will be at work in you and through you as we continue to work toward the future, discerning God's leading together for FRPC. Your continued participation, by giving from your hearts and from your hands, is vital and valued.

"Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise. She is a mistress and governess of those human emotions ... which control men or more often overwhelm them. ... Whether you wish to comfort the sad, to subdue frivolity, to encourage the despairing, to humble the proud, to calm the passionate, or to appease those full of hate ... what more effective means than music could you find?"

—Martin Luther

The above quote encapsulates the appreciation for music expressed by Luther and his fellow reformers. The result was a singing movement: the Reformation sang! And the "Battle Hymn" of the Reformation is "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," written by Luther himself. Inspired by Psalm 46 (particularly vss. 1-2 & the refrain in vss. 7 & 11), this hymn has become much-loved in every Christian tradition. When all seemed lost and every effort at amelioration appeared doomed, Luther would often say to his friend, Philipp Melanthon, "Let's sing the 46th Psalm" by which he meant Ein' feste burg, most often translated as "A Mighty Fortress". If Luther himself found strength for an arduous journey in these words, is it any surprise that Christians throughout the centuries since have similarly been fortified? Of course, Luther wrote his hymn in German, so we know it only through translations, which are necessarily modified to be singable. Below is a more literal translation ("woodenly literal" according to its translators), which is stronger and more personal than the Frederick Hedge translation with which you're most familiar. As we prepare for Reformation Day at the end of October, I invite you to take a few minutes to read Luther's verse anew. May we all find comfort and strength for the challenges of our own day in these words.

A Mighty Fortress Is Our God
A "Woodenly Literal" Translation
by John Piper, with Matthias Lohmann

A strong castle is our God,
A good defense and weapon.
He helps us become free from every misery
That has now affected us.
The old evil enemy
Is now in earnestness with his intents.
Great Power and much deception
Is his cruel armor.
On earth is not its likeness.

Even if the world were full of Devils
And would want to swallow us up,
We would not thus fear so very much.
We will nevertheless succeed.
The prince of this world,
How bitterly he might pretend to be,
Nevertheless will not do anything to us
Because he is judged.
A little word can fell him.

That word they shall let stand
And will have no thanks for it.
He is with us according to plan
With his Spirit and gifts.
If they take the body,
Goods, honor, child, and wife,
Let them go away.
They will have no profit.
The kingdom must remain for us.


With our power nothing is accomplished.
