Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:1-2, NASB)



As I write this entry for the newsletter, Keith and I are in Georgia, heading home after a wonderful time of study leave – plus a few vacation days – in Florida. We are all always heading *somewhere*; we are going in some direction. And in the most fundamental way, during Lent, we have an opportunity to be more mindful about our daily journey as Christ's disciples as we follow him to the cross.

Lent can wake us up a little and remind us that how we live our lives for Christ, inwardly and outwardly, is of great importance. This is true for us on an individual basis, and true for us as a church. Some big questions that arise as we follow him include:

- How do we steward all that we have and all that we are according to God's calling, the world's need, and our particular set of gifts as a church?
- Who are we in this season of the life of FRPC, and who is God calling us to be in this community as we move forward?

This is some of the work that we will be tackling together as a Session and as a church as we move forward on our journey together during this transitional time.

Some items on our to-do list will be, and have been, more process-oriented. These things are not exactly rocket science but it can take time to "straighten out what is left unfinished" (Titus 1:5) amidst all the other daily and weekly demands of life and ministry. We have already made two important process-related changes that grease the wheels for success moving forward: reducing the size of Session and adopting a new congregational rule for a quorum.

At the upcoming Session meeting, we will begin (1) to develop a timeline for addressing additional priority items, and (2) to set a realistic schedule for checking in with you as a congregation for both input and feedback as we move forward. The work ahead requires endurance from us all. The brand of endurance we need comes from spiritual training that is rooted in prayer, Scripture, and listening to and for the Spirit.

So part of our agenda overall will be to strengthen our spiritual muscles in these areas, and to increase opportunities for unity of focus in our learning and prayers and our listening. This, too, has already begun in our Read-Through-the-Bible program, meeting Sunday mornings. Hebrews 12, from which I quoted above, continues with the following exhortation later in the chapter:

Therefore, strengthen the hands that are weak and the knees that are feeble, and make straight paths for your feet, so that the limb which is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed. (Hebrews 12:12-13)

Of course, the author of the letter to the Hebrews was speaking metaphorically about strengthening those muscles in our spiritual and personal discipline, muscles that are needed for the task ahead. The work has begun and is ongoing. Keep praying.

In our Bible reading group, we have recently read the Lord's commissioning words to Moses' successor, Joshua: "Be strong and bold." (Deut. 31:23) He then repeats the charge multiple times in the book named for Joshua, saying "Be strong and courageous." Like God's people in that day, we will get to our destination but with the added benefit of having the Spirit to lead us, and we all have a role to play to get us there. The Lord bless you as we continue on the road, during Lent, Holy week, Easter and beyond.



As hard as it is to believe, April is upon us, and with it Holy Week and Resurrection Day. On Maundy Thursday (April 17), the choir will sing an anthem on a text adapted from a poem of Christina Rosetti (1830-1894). If you recognize her name, you most likely know her as the poet who wrote "In the Bleak Midwinter" and, perhaps (if you're an overachiever), "Love Came Down at Christmas." Actually she was a very prolific poet, publishing under her own name at a time when doing so was rare among women.

The hymn, "None other Lamb, none other Name" appears in 26 hymnals according to Hymnary.org and is paired with at least 5 tunes. The anthem we'll be singing uses an original tune by Jay Althouse, who also updated the language and added a bridge with new text. I've included both texts below for you to read and compare.

Both versions express the hope found only in Jesus, the Lamb of God, and speak of the author's desperation as hope burns low. Althouse's version specifically links that hope to the Cross...and subsequently is most appropriate for Holy Week. Rossetti's original, however, references the sacrificial nature of Christ's life and work only implicitly through the title "Lamb". Her third verse (replaced by Althouse with a repitition of the first verse) looks beyond the Cross to the Jesus as "Life" and even as the Provider of our ultimate home. And it's this hope of life beyond the grave and a secure home beyond earthly woe that enables us to walk through Holy Week without despair. I hope to see you on Maundy Thursday at 7:00 pm.


